Itinerary

Day 1 28 July AUCKLAND – SYDNEY

We depart Auckland on QF114 to arrive in Sydney at 2.00pm. Transfer to hotel. Dinner

Day 2 29 July SHANGHAI

Breakfast at the hotel.

This morning, transfer to the airport for our flight to Shanghai on QF129 at 9.25am. Arrive Shanghai at 6.15pm. Transfer to hotel. Dinner.

Day 3 30 July SHANGHAI

Breakfast at the hotel.

Today we will visit the Bund, a popular promenade along Huangpu River, where the old meets the modern in Shanghai. And then, visit Yu Garden, the most beautiful garden in Shanghai, which was built during the Ming Dynasty (1559). We will also visit Town's God Temple where people pray for happiness. Afterwards a wonderful cruise experience on the bustling Huangpu River. Dinner.

Day 4 31 July SHANGHAI –XIAN

Breakfast at the hotel.

This morning, transfer to the airport for a flight to Xi'an. After transferring and checking in at our hotel, we will sample an authentic Xi'an dumpling dinner, and watch a Tang Dynasty Show.

Day 5 1 August XIAN

Breakfast at hotel.

Morning tour to the greatest archaeological discovery of the century, the more than 2,000 year-old Terracotta Warriors which were interred with the Emperor Qin Shi Huang. Afterwards we will visit the Big Wild Goose Pagoda. Dinner



Day 6 2 August XIAN –BEIJING

Breakfast at hotel.

Today we leave Xian and fly to Beijing, the dynamic capital of the people's Republic of China. Once the imperial city of Mongol, Ming and Manchu emperors, Beijing today is still extraordinarily rich in historical sites and cultural relics. After clearing airport formalities, meet your guide and transfer to your hotel. Along the way, you will stop for photo opportunities at the China National Stadium (Bird's Nest) and China National Aquatics Centre (Water

Cube). Dinner tonight is at Quanjude Restaurant, where you will experience a famous Beijing Duck welcome banquet. After dinner, you will ride on a Chinese traditional boat across Houhai lake -put a candle in the lake to make a wish, it's sure to come true!

Day 7 3 August BEIJING

Breakfast at Hotel. Morning tour to the Great Wall at the Juyonguan section, stretching almost 4,000 miles from the Pacific Ocean to the sands of Central Asia and befittingly crowned one of the ten wonders of the world. After lunch, we will also tour The Ming Tombs, where the biggest number of emperors are buried in the world. After we return in the afternoon, we will go out for dinner followed by a visit to Wangfujing night market. Here you might like to top up on Chinese delicacies – roasted silkworms anyone?



Day 8 4 August BEIJING

Breakfast at Hotel. Tour Tian'anmen Square, the biggest public square in the world. Afterwards we will visit the Forbidden City, a vast complex of palaces, which was home to successive Emperors, museum and jewelry sections. Afterwards, we visit Beihai park, one of the oldest and most authentically preserved imperial gardens in China. Lunch is at Fangshan Restaurant, which is located in Beihai park. You will enjoy authentic imperial dishes, once served to China royal family.



After lunch, you will travel through a Hutong, by rickshaw, for a glimpse into Beijing's Yesterday. We'll return to the hotel to freshen up before going out for dinner.

Day 9 5 August BEIJING

Breakfast at Hotel. Today we visit famous Beijing Zoo, the biggest zoo in China. You will get close to pandas and other animals. After lunch, we will tour the Summer Palace by boat. The Summer Palace is dominated mainly by longevity Hill and Kuming Lake, covers an area of 2.9 square kilometers, three quarters of which is under water. It was a luxurious royal garden providing royal families with rest and entertainment. Afterwards, we will visit Lashe Teahouse for a tea ceremony. We'll return to the hotel to freshen up before going out for dinner.

Day 10 6 August BEIJING - SHANGHAI

Breakfast at hotel. Today we catch the bullet train back to Shanghai. From the comfort of your seat, enjoy the sights as we speed through town and countryside. Lunch and Dinner on the train. Transfer to hotel.

Day 11 7 August SHANGHAI—SYDNEY –AUCKLAND

Breakfast at hotel. We will visit Shanghai Museum, and then walk on Nanjing Road, one of the biggest shopping precincts in Shanghai. Free shopping time. Then we will transfer to the airport to catch our 7.45 evening flight back to Auckland on QF130. Dinner on flight.

Day 12 8 August AUCKLAND

Arrive in Sydney at 8.40 which allows us to stretch our legs before boarding our flight QF043 to Auckland to arrive at 5.10pm.
